5. Background Note of Training Workshop of Forestry and Rural Sustainable Development

5.1 Background

Forests provide a range of economic, social and environmental benefits, such as climate change mitigation, water and soil conservation, livelihood of local communities and poverty alleviation. The Asian-Pacific realm countries, particularly China and neighboring countries are mountainous. The residents are closely tied with their regional communities on forest resources. The communities' development and livelihood of the residents mainly rely on the forests. According to the research report of FAO, the income of these mountainous residents heavily relies on product harvested from the forests, although they are seasonal and subsistent. These products also help to resolve the needs from occasions of passage of life and hardship occurrence as well as increase the income.

With response to the Leaders' Declaration on Climate Change, Energy Security and Clean Development at the 15th APEC Economic Leaders' Meeting in September 2007 in Sydney, APFNet (Asia- Pacific Network for Sustainable Forest Management and Rehabilitation) Interim Secretariat was established aims to enhance capacity building and strengthen information sharing on sustainable forest management in the forestry sectors in the region.

The planning and management of forest resources and its relationship with the rural community is these countries' key element of regional development. The China's experiences of research and experiment on the correlation of community forest management and mountainous resident's livelihood has some measure of success. This calls an international cooperative means of bordering countries around this region to share the results of our experiences. This training workshop is an attempt of inviting and starting an exchange of wisdoms, successes and failures of all our neighboring nations. One of the hoped for results is to forge a means for forestry and community development of this mountainous border region.

5.2 The objectives

The workshop brings together experience, knowledge and lessons on forestry and rural sustainable development and related issues. Emphasis is on capacity development for forest practitioners across the region. Participants will be exposed to the following topics:

- Share the Chinese experience in reformation of forestry rights and exploitation of the mountain region.
- Raise the ability of the participants to improve regional forestry development of these communities.
- Force the participation of all residents in these regions.
- Reclaim of regional forestry and sustainable forestry management.

The combination of good practice by way of lectures, open and frank discussions and field trips offers a platform for sharing experiences and lessons learned on FRSD, as well as an opportunity to identify actual needs for future capacity development, and priorities that APFNet will need to facilitate and address in the future.

5.3 Approaches/Activities

The 20 days workshop consists of three parts: 1) A series of presentations involve the theory development and practice of social forestry, community development and forestry conflict management, regional residents and forestry policy-making, the development of Chinese forestry and rural area, cases on the development of forestry and rural area, and each presentation will be followed by a discussion. 2) A 7 days field excursion focuses on the management and development of the integrated forest resource utilization and mountain development. The main topics include wild mushroom resources, the utilization of bamboo and NTFP, planting and raising animals under forests. 3) Two days' Intercommunication among participants. Participants from each country will be required to prepare one country paper or their own study report with perspectives of FRSD which will be the inputs to the APFNet's strategies and work programme in the future. APFNet will provide a template of the country profile after receiving the registration form.

5.4 Eligible participants

Officials engaged in forestry, poverty reduction, natural resources management, natural environment protection and related study field in developing countries in Southeast Asia and South Asia, with fluency in English. One or two person(s) is/are allocated for each country. If two persons are from one country, one of them must be female.

5.5 Training Venue and local weather

6. Brief Introduction of Kunming City

6.1 Brief Introduction

Kunming, capital of Yunnan Province, with a history of more than 2400 years, owes its importance to the fact that it was the gateway to the celebrated Silk Road that facilitated trade with Tibet, Sichuan, Myanmar and India. Today the city is the political, economical and cultural center of Yunnan and the provincial center for transport, science and technology and consequently has become the most popular center for tourism in Southwest China.

Kunming enjoys a pleasant climate and does its best to live up to its title of 'the City of Eternal Spring'. Whenever you are planning to go, the temperature is always pleasant. With its convenient transport links in and out of the city, Kunming welcomes and sees off tens of thousands of tourists every day.

Kunming is the focal point of Yunnan minority culture. Some 26 ethnic minorities such as Yi, Bai, Miao, Dai, Hani and more inhabit the region. Each group has its own featured festivals such as the Torch festival of Yi people, the Golden Temple Fair and so on. The hugely successful 1999 International Horticultural Exposition enhanced Kunming's influence in the world resulting in a snowball effect upon tourism as more and more foreigners come to discover this enchanting part of China.

Its alluring highland scenery, bewitching karst landform, varied and exotic habitats and customs and places of historical interest can be found at major scenic spots such as Dianchi Lake, Stone Forest, the Village of Ethnic Culture, Grand View Pavilion, etc.

Kunming is also renowned for many delicious local dishes; the most famous ones are Across Bridge Rice Noodle and Xuanwei Ham. You can enjoy them both at local famous restaurants or the night market. In the night markets you will find many pubs, bars and cafes that serve good quality meals.

6.2 Kunming Climate

Kunming city is called "The City of Spring", with the average temperature is 18°C-26 °C during the workshop. In the morning and evening, the temperature is little lower. During the field trip, the temperature is much higher than Kunming because most visited places are located in southern part of Kunming.

7. Overview of Southwest Forestry University

Southwest Forestry University (SWFU) was initially founded as the Department of Forestry in Yunnan University in 1939. Following the establishment and merger of Kunming College of Agriculture and Forestry and Yunnan Forestry College, Southwest Forestry College was founded as a separate institution in 1978 and became an affiliate of China's Ministry of Forestry. During the general reform of China's higher education institutions in 2000, SWFU's affiliation to the State Forestry Administration was transferred to "an institution for joint development but predominantly managed by the Yunnan Provincial Government".

During 70 years of cumulative education experiences and 30 years of independent operation, the university has become the only institution of higher learning that specializes in forestry in the Western Region of China. Its campus is located in Kunming City in Yunnan Province. The university has been a recipient of the awards for "University of Excellence in Campus Greening in Yunnan", "National Advanced Greening Collective Institute", and National Model Institute for Greening Campaign".

SWFU's fields of study are mainly centered on disciplines relevant to forestry, with special features and excellence in environmental and biological subjects that encompass multidisciplinary degree programs in agriculture, science, engineering, law, arts and management. Its multi-tier education programs include mainly Bachelor's and Master's degrees, as well as continuing education programs. Also included are higher professional and vocational education programs, together with special programs for international students. The university's mission is to serve the economic and social development of the Southwest frontier regions of China by focusing on the building of a sound ecological environment and the development of the forestry sector in the region. SWFU is one of the first universities accredited for conferring a Master's Degree in 1982 since China adopted the reform and opening policies, and has been ratified as a university selected to develop PhD programs in 2009. Presently the university offers 28 Master's and 48 Bachelors' Degree programs.

In total, the university has nine faculties and five departments which have enrolled 12,463 fulltime students, including 817 students registered for Master's Degree programs and 11,155 for Bachelor's Degree programs. The university has 1,027 faculty members, including 739 instructors of whom 114 are professors, 282 associate professors, 10 mentors for PhD candidates and the rest are adjunct faculty members.

The university has developed an effective system of facilities and laboratories for its education and research programs, including 18 laboratories certified for basic and major courses in Yunnan province and 65 off-campus sites for field practicum. Amongst a large number of research institutes and centers, the university has developed one national-level research institute, one key laboratory of the Ministry of Education, one key laboratory of the State Forestry Administration (SFA), one key laboratory of Yunnan Province, three key laboratories for universities in Yunnan, two engineering (technical) research centers for universities in Yunnan, three model experiment centers for universities in Yunnan, one model laboratory for universities in Yunnan, and one training base for innovative scholars of Yunnan.

The teaching and research competency at SWFU pioneers its peer university Southwest Forestry University research, biodiversity and nature conservation, silviculture, forest management, forest protection, bamboo research, and wood science and technology. Unique regional features have developed in the fields of landscape gardening and ecotourism. Outstanding achievements were made in research on birds, fishes and ants.

The research funds received by the university in recent five years totals 160 million Chinese yuan. More than 3,000 papers, 110 monographs and six translated monographs have been published.

Our campus occupies 80 hectares and has an arboretum of 46.2 ha and floor space of 488,600 m². The university library stocks about 1.12 million books, and more than 226,000 volumes of electronic magazines and books that are shared on a campus network.

The university has established cooperative and exchange ties with universities and research institutes in the United States, Canada, France, Germany, Netherlands, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Thailand, Philippines and Vietnam for joint research and the training of graduate and undergraduate students. Based on reciprocal credit transferrable programs, SWFU has started to develop joint-education programs for undergraduate students based on “2+2” model, as well as exchanging graduate students for field practicum which are mandatory for thesis research with universities in the US, Canada, Netherlands, Thailand and Poland. Joint research and training programs have been conducted in cooperation with the World Wildlife Fund (WWF), the Global Environment Facility (GEF), The Nature Conservancy (TNC), the MacArthur Foundation and the Ford Foundation (FF).
