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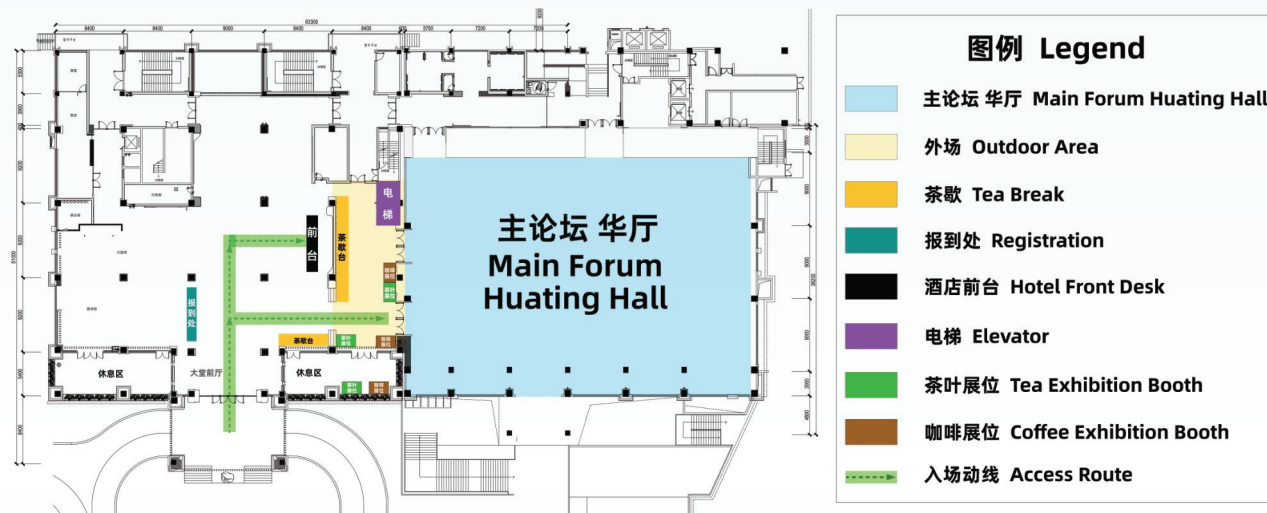

Pu'er Municipality Profile Basic Information

Pu'er Municipality covers a land area of 45,000 km², with mountainous terrain accounting for 98.3%, making it the largest prefecture-level city in Yunnan Province. It administers 1 district, 9 counties, 102 townships/towns, and 1 subdistrict, with a total population of 2.34 million by the end of 2023. Pu'er is home to 26 ethnic groups including the Hani, Yi, Lahu, Wa, Dai, etc., with ethnic minorities accounting for 61.2% of the population.

Beautiful Ecological Environment

The elevation of Pu'er ranges from 317 m to 3,370 m, with the urban center at 1,302 m. It spans five climatic zones: northern tropical, southern subtropical, central subtropical, northern subtropical, and temperate. The city enjoys over 315 frost-free days per year and an average annual temperature of 19.5 °C. It has 1 national wetland park, 3 national forest parks, and 18 nature reserves, preserving nearly one-third of China's species. Known as the largest oasis on the Tropic of Cancer, Pu'er boasts one of the highest climate comfort indexes, negative oxygen ion concentrations, and air cleanliness levels in Yunnan and even nationwide.

Unique Geographical Advantages

Pu'er borders Vietnam, Laos, and Myanmar, with a 486 km-long international boundary, including 4 border counties, 16 border townships/towns, and 44 border villages, and is adjacent to 6 prefectures/cities within Yunnan. The China-Laos Railway and the Kunming-Bangkok International Corridor run through the city. Pu'er has two airports (Pu'er Simao and Lancang Jingmai). It hosts two national-level ports (Meng kang Port and Simao Port), one provincial-level former secondary port (Menglian Port), and seven border trade passages.

Abundant Natural Resources

The city has 45.3 million mu of forest area, with a timber stock volume of 314



million m³ and a forest coverage rate of 68.23%. The multi-year average total water resources amount to 30.55 billion m³, with 12,700 m³ of water per capita. Pu'er is rich in mineral resources, with 2.03 billion tons of iron ore reserves, 518,000 tons of nickel metal, 16.33 million tons of potash, and 134,000 tons of rare earth oxide reserves.

Vibrant and Diverse Culture

Pu'er is the birthplace of the Ethnic Unity Oath Monument and the starting point of the Ancient Tea Horse Road. It has 9 ethnic autonomous counties; Lancang County is the only Lahu autonomous county in China, and Mojiang County is the only Hani autonomous county in the country. The city has several nationally protected cultural heritage sites, such as the Menglian Native Chieftain's Yamen and the Jingdong Confucian Temple. It also boasts invaluable natural and cultural relics, including the 35.4-million-year-old Jinggu broadleaf magnolia fossil, the 27-million-year-old Chinese magnolia fossil, and the over-2,700-year-old Zhenyuan Qianjiazhai Wild Old Tea Tree King.



Overview of Xiao'wazi Coffee Estate

Xiao'wazi Coffee Estate was established in 1997 by Ms. Liao Xiugui, a senior agronomist formerly with the Simao district Coffee and Tea Office and the Nestlé Simao Agronomy Department, who was responsible for coffee cultivation and extension. Adhering to the development philosophy of "green, ecological, and safe", the estate practices a three-dimensional ecological planting model that showcases a picturesque, garden-like landscape rich in biodiversity.

In 2019, Xiao'wazi Coffee Estate successfully transformed from a traditional coffee farm into an integrated coffee estate encompassing the primary, secondary, and tertiary industries. It now combines natural ecology, agricultural production, agroforestry landscapes, coffee culture, educational research, academic collaboration, and influencer-driven tourism, attracting nearly 80,000 visitors and hosting over 400 coffee education and research events.

From 2019 to 2022, the estate was continuously recognized with the title "Most Pu'er · Cultural Lifestyle." In 2021, it was named a Pu'er Internet-famous Coffee Estate; in 2022, it obtained the right to use the National Geographical Indication (GI) mark and established a National GI Coffee Plantation Demonstration Base; in 2023, it earned the Green Food Certification, and in 2024, it was honored as a Yunnan Provincial Boutique Coffee Estate.



Overview of “Beautiful Star Village · Whispering Wind Coffee Valley” in Pu’er

Bai Shapo Beautiful Star Village is located in the Bai Shapo group, Nandaohe Village, Nanping Town, Simao District, Pu’er City, Yunnan Province. Leveraging its coffee industry and ethnic cultural assets, it adopts an innovative “village party committee + village cooperative + enterprise + farmers + social organizations” model. The project spans the full coffee value chain – from “seed to cup” – integrating primary, secondary, and tertiary industries. With support from the Shanghai-Yunnan collaborative fund and the integration of Starbucks’ donated public welfare funds, the coffee industry is driving rural revitalization. The site is being developed into a “shared-value Beautiful Star Village,” themed around coffee and combining agriculture, culture, and tourism – a model rural revitalization demonstration under Shanghai-Yunnan cooperation. It has been selected as a case study for a special topic class in the 2024 national rural revitalization training organized by China’s Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs, and shortlisted in Xinhua Net’s “2024 Cases in Rural Revitalization Practice.” To date, the project has established 20 distinctive experiential businesses, provided employment to 23 villagers (including those from surrounding villages), and supported 4 households in entrepreneurship. In the four months since operation began, the project has reached over 500 million global media impressions and welcomed more than 120,000 visitors. It has directly increased collective and farmer incomes by over RMB 1 million, and indirectly driven additional income growth of more than RMB 3 million among local and neighboring farmers.



Overview of Beigui Coffee Estate

Beigui Coffee Estate commenced operations in August 2024. It adopts a "Estate + Village Collective + Base" model, establishing the "Shenjiu" Space Coffee Breeding and Tasting Center, Coffee Research and Education Center, restaurant, and outdoor experiential spaces. The estate encompasses 2,000 acres of standardized coffee plantations and 350 acres of water-nutrient integrated modern agricultural facilities. It has developed into a comprehensive coffee estate integrating ecological coffee planting, processing, experiential activities, dining, tourism, and leisure vacations. Through a "regional leading enterprise + social capital operation-first" approach, the estate partners with Ghana (Haikou) Agricultural Co., Ltd. to develop the BEANGREAT Beigui Coffee Warehouse brand. Guided by the philosophy of "Harmonious Coexistence," Beigui Coffee aims to promote coffee culture and the Yunnan slow-lifestyle, providing a one-stop experience that includes in-depth educational tours, light resort accommodations, local cuisine, and music and arts. The estate is not only a place to savor global coffee but also a tranquil destination that seamlessly integrates nature, coffee, and life—sharing Yunnan's coffee, scenery, and moments with every visitor.



Overview of Gushan · Yeyatang Valley Coffee Estate

The Gushan · Yeyatang Valley Coffee Estate is a joint initiative developed by Gushan Cultural Tourism, the People's Government of Simao District (Pu'er City), the Simao Farm Group, and Zhaobitan Agriculture. The project embodies a cross-sector innovation that integrates green, low-carbon principles, industrial synergy, and sustainable development, creating a refined and inspiring lifestyle destination for coffee lovers.

Centering on the deep integration of cultural tourism and the coffee industry, the estate spans the entire coffee value chain—from planting, harvesting, processing, and roasting to tasting and experiential tourism. It also features a comprehensive cultural-tourism sector, including educational programs, dining, lodging, and curated events.

To date, the estate has established a series of landmark facilities such as the Coffee Experience Center, Rainforest Art Restaurant, Garden Homestay, Luxury Camping Grounds, and the Coffee Cultivation and Processing Zone.

Through its professional and immersive coffee experiences, the estate attracts coffee enthusiasts from Pu'er and across China, inviting them to wander through the poetic landscapes of mountains and forests, and to find resonance among like-minded communities—allowing every coffee-loving soul to find peace, connection, and inspiration amid nature.
